



2018 HOLIDAY POP-UP ICE SKATING RINK RULES & CODE OF CONDUCT

- The maximum number of (20) skaters will be allowed on each session.
- Skating hours may change due to weather.
- Skate at your own risk.
- We reserve the right to refuse admission to anyone not meeting the standards of good behavior and to evict persons not following the policies of this ice rink.
- Management is not responsible for items stolen or left within or near rink or shoe area.
- No one is permitted on ice without skates.
- No more than two people may hold hands while skating.
- Do not leave the ice skating rink area once your skates are on. Skates should only be worn while on the rink or rubber matting. Concrete and brick surfaces permanently damage skates.
- Please change your shoes and skates in the designated area.
- No sitting on dasher boards, counters or table tops.
- No food or beverages may be brought into the ice rink or placed on the rink sides. Chewing gum is not allowed inside the ice rink.
- No alcoholic beverages are permitted on the rink.
- No smoking permitted anywhere on the rink or in the shoe-changing area.
- No pets of any kind permitted on ice.
- No one is permitted to carry anything in their hands on the ice rink without the expressed approval of management. Anyone wearing skates is not permitted to carry a child.
- Before leaving, we ask that you please return your rental skates to the rental skate counter.
- We reserve the right to check all bags.

These rules are in addition to Code of Conduct/Regulations for Ice Skaters

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ICE RINK: Skaters understand and agree to all of the following:

- You must refrain from acting in a manner that may cause or contribute to injury to yourself or others. We promote clean, fun, friendly and safe behavior for our guests/customers; inconsiderate behavior by guests/customers will not be tolerated. No pushing, fast skating, reckless skating or playing tag.
- Accept responsibility for knowing the range of his/her ability while on skates, and skate within the limits of that ability. Maintain reasonable control of his/her speed and course at all times.
- Maintain a proper skating distance to lookout and avoid other skaters, objects or conditions on the surface of the rink.

- Read and abide by all posted signs, warnings and cooperate with staff.
- Not skate while under the influence of drugs, alcohol or other control impairing substances.
- Skaters understand the assumption of risk agreement; by engaging in skating, skaters are deemed to have knowledge of, and assume the inherent risks of skating, which include but are not limited to the following:
 - Injuries that result from collisions or contact with other skaters or other individuals who are on the skating surface.
 - Injuries that result from falls.
 - Injuries that involve objects or artificial structures that are properly within the intended path of travel of the skater.
- Spectators understand the assumption of risk:
 - Spectators understand and shall comply with each posted sign or warning and assume the inherent risks related to a skating rink.
